Guest seating is offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Ushers will be stationed throughout the building to direct all guests to the best possible seats.


Venue staff are trained to assist with special seating for guests in wheelchairs and with limited mobility.

A graduate may be seated anywhere within a school's section. If you're a doctoral student, coordinate with the faculty member who will hood you to meet up at the Lee Norvelle Theatre and Drama Center in time for lineup.
